\*\*Day 1: Monday - Focus on Pirates of the Caribbean\*\*

- \*\*Objective:\*\*

## Lesson / Instruction

- \*\*Lesson Plan: "Hey Baby" Sight Reading and Distribution\*\*
- \*\*Introduction:\*\*



- 1. Begin by discussing the importance of sight-reading in music and how it helps musicians quickly learn and perform new pieces.
- 2. Introduce the new song "Hey Baby" and provide some background information about the style, composer, or any interesting musical elements.
- 3. Review key musical terms that may appear in the sheet music, such as tempo markings, dynamics, and articulations.
- \*\*Warm-up:\*\*


